SHRIMP BOAT SOUND -THE STUDIO THAT ROSS BUILT

T'S NO MYSTERY WHY JIMMY BUFFETT HAS REMAINED SUCCESS-FUL IN THE CUT-THROAT MUSIC BUSINESS WHERE "HEY BUDDY, KEEP YOUR DAY JOB" IS CONSIDERED A COMPLIMENTARY RE-MARK. JIMMY CONTINUES TO SURROUND HIMSELF WITH THE BEST AVAILABLE TALENT, FROM MUSICIANS TO SOUND MEN. WHEN HE DECIDED TO BUILD HIS OWN PRIVATE RECORDING STUDIO, "SHRIMP BOAT SOUND", HE WENT TO ROSS RITTO. ROSS HAS BEEN JB'S AUDIO ENGI-NEER FOR THE LAST 12 YEARS, STARTING WHEN JIM-MY WAS THF OPENING ACT FOR THE LAGLES. ROSS HAS WORKED BOTH ON THE ROAD AND IN THE STU-DIO, BUT IS EQUALLY SUIT-ED FOR BOTH. HIS STUDIO

WORK INCLUDES STEVE GOODMAN AND PABLO CRUISE ALBUMS: HE HAS TOURED WITH JACKSON BROWNE, JESSE COLIN YOUNG, AND MOST RE-CENTLY, TOM WAITS. SOUND IMAGE', A "TOUR-ING SOUND REINFORGE-MENT" COMPANY IN LOS ANGELES OWNED BY ROSS AND HIS PARTNER, SUPP-LIES AUDIO ENGINEERS FOR MANY CONCERT ACTS IN LA. AND SAN DIEGO. ROSS ALSO UNASHAMED-LY ADMITS TO BEING THE AUDIO CONSULTANT FOR THE ROSE BOWL IN PASA-DINA CALIFORNIA I SPENT THE GREATER PART OF AN AFTERNOON WITH ROSS, BUMMING CIGARETTES AND INFORMATION ON JIM-MY'S NEWLY CONSTRUCT-ED PRIVATE RECORDING STUDIO 'SHRIMP BOAT SOUND'.

ROSS: No. an instrument could occupy more than one track. A set of drums, for instance, could take up to 10, add a guitar and vocals and 16 tracks are shot. Initially the studio was to have been for Jimmy to make demo tapes or try out new ideas. He then realized that with a little more time and effort (and money) he could have a professional recording studio. So now we have a board capable of recording and mixing a full 32 tracks. CT: So you would say this studio is comparable to any you've worked in in the past? ROSS: Absolutely. We have one of the best keyboard setups in the country, a custom built AMEK board, two 16 track FOSTEX recorders, and the master stereo recorder for the final mix into stereo. But the good thing about this studio is that it



CT: What is all this stuff? **ROSS:** This is a classic 1955 HAMMOND B-3 ORGAN coupled with a KREG SAM-PLING GRAND PIANO channeled into a custom built AMEK ANGELA multitrack console technologically integrated with a binary synchronistically linked 16 track FOSTEX tape biformation.

CT: (Pause) What is all this stuff?

ROSS: We originally set up the studio to operate with a simple 16 track sound board, but outgrew that before the first note was recorded.

CT: Why is that? Doesn't each track represent a different instrument?

also has its own personality. This is the kind of studio I would expect Jimmy Buffett to have. Most studios are pretty stiff or stylized, look around here; it's colorful, it's pleasant, we've got a basketball hoop in the studio ... plus the location is great.

CT: Bet it cost a bundle.

ROSS: Yeah, but I know a few tricks. For example, a full 32 track recorder is very expensive, but I was able to synchronize the 2 FOSTEX recorders together to get full 32 track capability. **CT:** Pretty technically advanced stuff, is this routine?

vanced stuff, is this routine? **ROSS:** No, this is really sophisticated equipment.

There are only a few around, and even fewer of us who can use them properly. **CT:** And you're one of those select few.

ROSS: Yeah, I guess.

CT: So how about the new album, will that be recorded here?

ROSS: Theoritically we could, but we're not going to. There are still a few bugs to work out in the system, and it's better to have all that done before laying out a new album. When Jimmy does an album he does it quick. He'll only record a song a couple of times. When it sounds right to him, we go with it. I've worked with other guys who'll record a song over and over, using every new technological toy available until in my opinion the heart and soul of the song are replaced with computer bytes and digital readouts. This spontaneity can be felt on the album. He performs that way on stage too. The live "You Had To Be There" album is a good example. So many other groups record a live album and then head back to the studio for overdubbing. Some "live" albums are recorded more in the studio than on stage. Our live album is totally live, everything on it is exactly what the people heard at the concerts. It went gold, too.

CT: The heading for this article is "The studio that Ross built". How much did you really build?

ROSS: The shell was here, but we gutted the building and started from scratch. We got offices, the sound room, the studio... and even a lounge with a TV and refrigerator, Bob the carpenter and I did most of the work ourselves. The studio is acoustically sound and electrically we're ready to go. This is the first time I've been involved in a studio from the bottom up.
