

Don't Stop T

Jimmy Buffett has long been a master of the wistful, witty, threeminute musical short story. Now 50, Buffett's middle aged craziness - a time when many other guys merely cheat on their wives or chuck secure careers to scratch some harebrained itch - made him fall hard for the siren song of musical theater.

The result, "Don't Stop the Carnival", the Buffett-Herman Wouk musical that had its world premiere at Miami's Coconut Grove Playhouse, proves that certain kinds of insanity can be good for you.

What "Don't Stop the Carnival" already has going for it are an engaging story, melodies that will rumble pleasurably in your head for days; lyrics both wry and wrenching a great cast, a scorching band in Iko-Iko and loads of visual flash.



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On the flip side, this "Carnival" is as jam-packed and overstimulating as the real thing. Director-choreographer David Bell and the show's creators have tried to cram 24 hours worth of entertainment and story into a three-hour show.

Buffett, Wouk and company shouldn't make Broadway-bound travel arrangements just yet. "Carnival" needs more work, and lots of it. But that's what first productions are for.

"Carnival" relates the "legend" of Norman Paperman, a theatrical press agent who decides to retire at 49 to run a cozy tropical hotel on the Caribbean island of Kinja. When the very married Norman isn't chasing the beautiful and bitter ex-actress who lives at his Gulf Reef Club, he's dealing with disasters that are as plentiful as palm fronds.

A lot of repeats or different ways of the same phrase -FINZ or FINS2L, FINS2R, the MANA-T or MANATE. There were many, many different ways to state Parrot Head. One was PYRIT and another PYRIT 40 - from 2 separate states. Some were thinking of Key West when they chose DUVAL ST or MILE 0. Our two favorites though were 3QTRTYM and GO2CIB.

When most travelers picture Jamaica, they envision a tropical paradise of sun, surf, and sand. Sadly, the Blue Mountain Mecca has numerous resorts that physically isolate the visitor from the island. Another gem is Jake's Place, located on the undeveloped southwest coast at Treasure Beach near a small fishing village. Jake's has managed to remain true to Jamaican simplicity. The seaside cottages and rooms are cooled by ceiling fans and natural breezes, yet each is equipped with the modern convenience of a CD player. From the private beach cove, you can go on a fishing, canoe or snorkeling trip, or trek on a mountain bike trail to view the waterfalls.

Only 50 minutes from the sea are the Blue Mountains. Summer temperatures are more like the Smokey Mountains than the tropics. Island Outpost's Strawberry Hill is a perfect retreat for relaxation. Set 3000 feet high in the mountains, you can enjoy a massage, hike through the local Blue Mountain Coffee plantations, or take an eco-tour to view rare flora and fauna.

X-COUNTRY RUN TO SAVE ANIMALS

Joe Nolfo of Oldsmar, FL holds a world record in distance swimming, is an avid golfer, has raised thousands of dollars for charities, and this summer plans to travel from Florida to California raising money for the Associated Humane Society. Joe Nolfo has guts, determination, a big heart and one leg.

A victim of a late night hit and run along U.S. 41, Joe spent 5 weeks in a coma, and another 6 months recovering. When many would still be in the denial phase, Joe went way past acceptance and drew courage from stories of others who chose to follow their dreams. When the hospital moved Joe to its rehab unit, he was told he couldn't leave until he learned to walk with crutches, a six to eight week undertaking. It took him a couple of days. He was fitted with an artificial limb, but gets around quicker on his crutches.

Joe ran his own business for many years, but had changed his views on what was important to him. "I wanted to do something exciting and different with my life. I have always been athletic, so I decided to use this to show people that not all physically challenged people are 'disabled'."

"I decided that I would cross the country in a racing wheelchair to raise funds for a charity." The next step was to locate a charity to dedicate the run to. Joe chose the Associated Humane Society, a group that supports all animals, domestic and wild. They also own the Popcorn Park Zoo, the only zoo in the country that welcomes elderly, sick, abandoned or handicapped wildlife. The Zoo's directors have complete faith in Joe Nolfo's integrity, high personal ability and strength of character, and are delighted he chose them.

Joe writes, "This is what I want to do with my life from now on. I chose to do the cross country to possibly inspire other people with handicaps to 're-start' their lives. So many of them have lost hope. After my swim I was called by organizations to speak to other handicapped people in hopes that they will see that they aren't limited to 'boring lives.'

Margaritaville is helping Joe reach his goal, and we invite Parrot Heads across the country to get involved as well. Joe's route will be published in the Coconut Telegraph and on this web site. If he happens to come by your area, try and catch up with him and let him know you heard it on the Coconut Telegraph.

Joe's journey begins July 1 in Homasassa Springs, FL and proceeds north to Pensacola Beach, through Gulf Breeze and then begins his westward run for California. The following are some of the bigger cities Joe passes on his way. Check the date, find some time, and give him a Parrot Head pat on the back.

By August 1 Joe will be in Mobile,AL. Then on to Jackson, MS 8/6, New Orleans 8/15, Lake Charles, LA on 9/2 and into Beaumont, TX by 9/5. The city names become less familiar after Austin, TX on 9/18; Voca, Concho, Big Lake, Grand Falls and into Loving, NM on 10/16. White Sands National Monument on 10/24, Silver Clty on 11/5 and into Clifton, AZ on 11/7. Phoenix on 11/21 and across the California border border at Blythe on 12/4. Joshua Tree on 12/12 and finally into Los Angeles on 12/20.
