MUSICIANS FROM EARLY IN YOUR CAREER SUCH AS DOYLE GRISHAM AND ROGER HAWKINS APPEAR ON SEVERAL SONGS RECORDED IN MUSCLE SHOALS, ALABAMA. IS THIS A CONSCIOUS EFFORT TO "RETURN TO YOUR ROOTS?"

I LAUGH AT THE THOUGHT OF ANYTHING I DO BEING A CONSCIOUS EFFORT. I HAVE SAID IT BEFORE AND I WILL REPEAT IT AGAIN, I MAINLY MAKE IT UP AS I GO ALONG. GOING TO MUSCLE SHOALS AND LETTING MAC AND UTLEY COMBINE AS PRODUCERS SEEMED A GOOD THING AT THE TIME AND I WAS IN AN "ALABAMA (AS OPPOSED TO NEW YORK) STATE OF MIND." MY SISTER HAD MOVED HOME AND WAS **OPENING A RESTAURANT IN THE BAIT SHACK WHERE** MY DAD AND I USED TO LAUNCH OUR FISHING BOAT. ALABAMIANS HAD ELECTED A GOVERNOR WHOM YOU DIDN'T HAVE TO IMMEDIATELY HAVE TO APOL-OGIZE FOR, AND MAC TOLD ME ROGER HAWKINS AND DAVID HOOD WERE PLAYING THEIR ASSES OFF. GETTING IN TOUCH WITH DOYLE WAS MY CALL BECAUSE I DID WANT TO HEAR SOME STEEL GUITAR ON A FEW OF THE THINGS I HAD WRITTEN, AND HE INVENTED THE JIMMY BUFFETT STEEL GUITAR SOUND. SO I GUESS ALL ROADS LED TO MUSCLE SHOALS.

THIS IS WHAT YOU GET FOR BEING AROUND SO LONG. I USED TO LOVE THE TAMS AND STILL DO, AND THEY WERE A BIG PART OF GROWING UP - HARMONIES AND STYLE. WHEN THIS SONG CAME OUT THE WAY IT DID, I THOUGHT ABOUT SEEING IF THEY WERE STILL AROUND. WHEN THEY GOT TO NEW YORK TO DO THE SESSION, I ARRIVED LATE AND THEY HAD FINISHED THE OVERDUB AND CHARLES POPE SAID, "WE AIN'T USED TO SINGING WITH WHITE BOYS, BUT YOU DO PRETTY GOOD." I'LL TAKE THAT. BEACH MUSIC JUST PLAYS ON.

### DESCRIBE THE COLLAB-ORATION BETWEEN THE OLD AND NEW CORAL REEFERS.

COLLABORATING IS HARD WORK SINCE ALL WRITERS THINK THEIR STUFF IS THE BEST, AND WELL THEY SHOULD. THE GREATEST THING ABOUT THIS BAND IS THE IMMENSE TALENT THAT IT CONTAINS, SO I NATURALLY TAKE ADVANTAGE OF IT TO SHORE UP MY SHORTCOMINGS. HEY, THEY HAVE TO EARN THAT PER DIEM.

### A PBS MIND IN AN MTV WORLD, WE SEEM MIRED IN A SOUND BITE WORLD. ANY SUGGESTIONS?

### Hi Jimmy -

I have been getting a number of inquiries from journalists recently. There is a lady in London who has just written an "Adventurous Lives" article for POLO Magazine in USA about me carrying a polo stick around in the back of my plane. There is a former editor from OUTSIDE magazine and a few others who have written to me about possible articles. I am writing you to ask for your advice. I used to have a photo agent, but my previous literary agent (who is Marlene Dietrich's grandson) asked me to take my film away from him because of some silly dispute the two of them had. Since then, I have been a bit cool on the literary agent fellow, and I have been trying to supply photos for magazines by myself from what I carry around in the back of the plane. I have a lot of slide stock at home, and I am wondering if you have any ideas for me on photo agents. I like the small guys with the big hearts who you can trust. Do you know of any people that I could write to who might have some ideas on a photo agent to handle my slides? I have been up in northern Burma and also northern Thailand; recently, where I was radio tracking elephants from the air for WWF and working on a Geographic film called Animal Rescue. I am now working on the plane and getting ready to go track Tigers with some WCS guys along the Cambodian border with photo traps. Hopefully by the end of May, I will have my clearances organized for Laos, Vietnam and Cambodia. I hope you are well and that you are keeping your hand on the throttle when you can.

Just a follow up note after reading your photo note. I must have been reading your mind as I seem to share your view of the "go between" world. Two quick suggestions. First of all go direct when possible. I have enough contacts with people who run magazines who I think would be interested in your photos and probably a story if you were comfortable with that. I know that if I could find the time and catch up with you in Asia or the Pacific, I would still love to do a piece about flying with you for a week which is a shoe in at several spots. Terry MacDonald, the editor of Men's Journal is an old friend and former editor who I have the utmost respect for. Walter Issacson at Time has asked me to do a story for him on whatever I want. That's nice work when you can get it. As for photos, I don't know any photo agents, but I do know some good photographers who I could ask. Let me know what you want to do, and then not to reiterate, but National Geographic has offered me basically the same kind of deal and I think it is in the cards for us to spend a few hours in a cockpit. Let me know what you think.

We are close. I think. I am in Hong Kong on my way to Bali for a week and then will be in Sydney before flying home. I want to send you a copy of the new album. Your courage and determination are truly an inspiration to me, and if I can help you in any way with the "bidness" end of your amazing voyage consider it done. Just for your info, like most other things out there, the publishing world and the frenzied media have only gotten worse when it comes to exploitation without regard to facts or passion, geography and or history. I still have a like for all of the above. There is a new song on the album - I still call them albums and that dates me called "Oysters and Pearls". There is a lot of the Lindbergh's in there, but also I had large visions of that wonderful painting of your plane and the storm over Africa.

I know Chris Weber from many years ago working with Jodi Cobb. As far as my personal dealings are concerned, those folks at National Geographic are still very good and actually have approached me about writing for them. I think I might. My big picture plan is to do a big show in Los Angeles on the Millennium. (I would rather be working. Show folk have always considered New Year's Eve to be amateur night and would prefer to be working and the Millennium takes that notion to supreme heights.) I plan to stay in L.A. for a few days to make sure the world doesn't end and then fly to Hawaii with my family for a week. After that the plan is to join the Albatross in Tahiti where she will be shipped via freighter in November and fly her back through the islands to Hawaii at 500 feet. It is to be a fun trip and any coverage has to be done in that spirit, not as a feature. That may be our time to rendezvous. If you have an address that will work via Fed Ex. I will send you the album. It will be the first in Asia as it isn't scheduled for release in the states until late May. Consider it my gift to you. As Lindbergh said, "We are of the stars". Good luck and east still never does turn into west. Hey that could be your book title.

Bill Wharton is the Sauce Boss, a Florida blues man who makes his own hot sauce, and feeds his audiences gumbo. Since 1990, the Sauce Boss has delighted the crowds with his high-energy "dinner" music. No schmaltz here, but instead, it's a git-down, soul-shouting picnic of rock-nroll brotherhood.

The Ingredients, with John Babich on keyboards, and Magic John Jones on bass, are always ready, willing, and able, to sear the juice into the blues.
